Our Awana Club

Awana takes place between 6:50 and 8:15 on Wednesday nights during the school year. We follow the Lake Washington School District calendar for closures and breaks.

Registration: 6:40 to 6:55 PM

Opening Ceremony: 7:00 PM (*)

- Flag Ceremony, singing, announcements and recognitions.

Handbook Time: 7:25 to 7:45 PM

- Clubbers will move to their rooms for sections, stories and lessons, depending on club.

Council Time: 7:50 to 8:10 PM

- Clubbers return to auditorium for theme-based council time, closing activities and recognition.

Club time ends at 8:10 PM. We will be careful to end on time. Clubbers will be released to parents as they arrive; no clubber will be released without a parent or guardian present.

(*) Due to Washington State COVID-19 restrictions, doors are closed and locked at 7:05 pm. No late arrivals will be admitted.

How You can Help us!

Please provide current registration information. Include pertinent medical information, contact or address changes and emergency contacts, along with permission to participate in Awana.

Clubbers or family members that are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or similar conditions should not attend AWANA until all symptoms are cleared.

Each Awana club has a specially designed uniform; your clubber must earn the right to wear their uniform by passing the entrance test for the club. Clubbers are then eligible to purchase handbooks and uniforms. Uniforms take about 3 weeks to be delivered. Once earned, they should be worn every week to Awana, unless a theme or dress-up night is scheduled.

Your clubber should also bring their Bible every week.

Costs

There is a weekly fee to attend Awana. We charge **\$1 per clubber per week** to cover basic club costs. If you wish to pay the entire year's club fee in advance, there is a sliding cost structure based on family size:

\$30 for the first child

\$25 for the second child

\$20 for the third child

\$15 for the fourth child

\$10 for the fifth/subsequent child

There is also an additional cost for each **clubber manual** purchased. **Uniforms** vary in cost based on age/size of the clubber and program.

Awana Standards

1. Due to Washington State COVID-19 restrictions, Clubbers must be registered and in the building by 7:00 PM. Doors will be locked at 7:05 and no late arrivals will be allowed into the building. Our doors will remain locked until 8:10 pm.
2. Clubbers or family members that are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or similar conditions should not attend AWANA until all symptoms are cleared.
3. Nightly registration for AWANA will include a temperature assessment and standard health questions before clubbers are allowed to attend.
4. **No clubber is allowed to leave the grounds** without permission during club time. If you need to take your clubber home before our scheduled closing time, please make arrangements by contacting the AWANA Secretary at **425.214.6800**.
5. When leaders begin the AWANA “3 count”, all clubbers are expected to be quiet and ready to listen for instructions.

Awana Standards (continued)

6. There should not be any rough play at any time, including before or after club time.
7. Appropriate attire for club includes good shoes for playing, shorts or pants, and an AWANA uniform vest or shirt.
8. Our Awana club will follow a “three strikes” policy for discipline.
 - Strike 1: Warning from a leader
 - Strike 2: Counsel from the Commander
 - Strike 3: Family will be called to pick up the clubber.
10. If you have questions, contact your clubber’s leader or the commander.

We maintain a disciplined, safe, and loving environment for your clubber. You are always welcome to stay and participate with your clubber; Due to Washington State COVID-19 restrictions, Doors will be locked at 7:05 PM and unlocked at 8:10 PM.
